60-Year-Old Dream of Sarvepalli Canal Bank Residents Realized



- State Cabinet approves housing pattas for 1,215 impoverished families

Nellore, September 4: The long wait for thousands of im-

poverished families living along the Sarvepalli canal bank in Nellore city has finally come to an end. The State Government has taken a crucial decision to grant housing pattas (land ownership documents) to 1,215 families who have been living there without legal rights for nearly six decades. With the State Cabinet approving this proposal, the hopes of the poor—who had long awaited the right to their own homes—have been fulfilled. Although many families have resided in the Sarvepalli canal bank area for 60 years, granting official ownership rights was previously impossible because the occupied land fell under the category of canal *poramboke* (government-owned land reserved for pub-

lic utility). Consequently, the residents lived in constant fear of eviction. Despite repeated assurances from previous governments, no permanent solution had been found. Against this backdrop, Minister for Municipal Administration and Urban Development Narayana took a special initiative to bring the issue to the government's attention. He explained the hardships faced by the canal bank residents to Chief Minister Nara Chandrababu Naidu and urged him to take measures to grant them legal rights. The government has prioritized this issue, just as it did with the resolution of the Bhagat Singh Colony problem. During the recent cabinet meeting, the matter was discussed at length, and approval was granted to reclassify 22.31 acres out of a total of 62.70 acres of 'canal poramboke' (canal-adjacent government land) to 'AW Dry' status.

Minister Lays Foundation Stone for Development Works in Nidadavole

Nidadavole, September 4: Another step has been taken towards infrastructure development in Nidadavole town. State Minister Kandula Durgesh laid the foundation stone for the construction of a compound wall



near Subbarajupeta Park in the 17th Ward, a project funded by SC/ST allocations. Speaking on the occasion, he stated that development activities are proceeding with the aim of providing improved facilities to the public. The

Minister revealed that the compound wall construction near Subbarajupeta Park is being undertaken at an estimated cost of approximately ₹30 lakhs. He noted that upon completion, the project would enhance the park's security and provide a more comfortable environment for the public. He added that the government is focusing specifically on protecting public assets within the town. Subsequently, the Minister laid the foundation stone for new drainage construction works in Chettevari Street and Marapatlavari Street. He stated that these works are being carried out at an estimated cost of around ₹17 lakhs. He mentioned that priority was given to these projects in light of the difficulties residents face due to drainage issues. The Minister affirmed that improving sanitation conditions in the town is a primary objective of the government.

Tirupati, September 4: Chandragiri police conducted a special awareness program regarding law and order and public safety in view of the Vinayaka Chavithi festival. Chandragiri Police Inspector M. Suresh Kumar, Sub-Inspector E. Arunachalam, and the Thondavada Panchayat Secretary participated in the event, offering guidelines to pandal organizers, youth, and local residents. They emphasized that it is everyone's duty to celebrate the



festival responsibly and with devotion. Speaking on the occasion, the police advised that obtaining prior permission from the concerned authorities is mandatory for setting up Vinayaka pandals. They stressed the importance of adhering to safety standards while installing electrical connections, sound systems, and decorations. Organizers were urged to take precautions to prevent accidents and to make necessary arrangements to avert fire hazards. They also requested that pandals be set up in a manner that does not obstruct public move-



ment. The police highlighted the need for special precautions during the Vinayaka idol immersion process. They made it clear that no scope would be given for anti-social activities or participation under the influence of alcohol during immersion processions. They advised the youth to act responsibly and strictly follow traffic regulations. They warned that government guidelines regarding the use of DJs and sound systems must be followed.

Is a Model School teacher running a private college while neglecting their duties at the government school?



Amarapuram, September 4: There are strong allegations that some teachers employed by the government and government-affiliated institutions are drawing salaries and allowances while neglecting their official duties to secretly run private colleges and hostels. Specifically, it is alleged that a teacher employed at the Model School in Settur Mandal has rented a warehouse along the Sira Road in Amarapuram. Without obtaining government permission, they are reportedly conducting educational activities—including running a combined hostel and college for boys and girls. Locals are questioning the propriety of a teacher conducting such private educational activities in a different constituency while employed at a government school. Since Amarapuram Mandal is located in a remote area bordering Karnataka, people allege that such teachers believe neither the government nor officials will notice their actions, making it easy for them to bypass regulations and deceive the government. The public urges higher authorities to respond and take action against such individuals—including revoking any permissions if granted—and instead focus on developing and promoting government colleges.

Their demands include the payment of full (100%) salaries, the provision of Provident Fund (PF) facilities, and the granting of benefits such as ₹50 lakh ex-gratia, medical leave, and health cards to employees on duty. He asserted that their unity is their strength and affirmed that the 30-day action plan would be fully implemented. Mahaboob Jan, Padma, Kama-lamma, Jayamma, Mahadevi, Umarani, Ashwini, Muskan, Hari, Radhakrishna, Chinna Lalitha, and others participated in the event.

Power Supply Disruption Likely in Puttaparthi Area

Public Cooperation Requested: Electricity Department EE Sivaramulu

Puttaparthi:Electricity Department Executive Engineer O. Sivaramulu announced that power supply disruptions are likely in the Puttaparthi, Bukapatnam, Gorantla, and Kothacheruvu mandals. He

stated that maintenance work requiring a 'Line Clear' (LC) permit is being undertaken on the 132 kV Kadiri-Puttaparthi power line. The work is scheduled to take place from 8:00 AM on September 5 to 7:00 PM on September 7. He explained that during this period, only a single power

supply route would be available for the Puttaparthi 132 kV substation, and any unforeseen breakdown could result in an interruption to the power supply. EE Sivaramulu requested the public to understand the situation and cooperate with the Electricity Department.



Suspense Surrounds Konda Surekha's Key Decision



- Signal on social media: "The wait is over"
- Susmitha challenges Revanth Reddy
- Political circles discuss the Konda family's next move

September 4: Former Minister Konda Surekha has finally broken her silence following her dismissal from the cabinet. She announced via social media that she would soon reveal a crucial decision. Her post, stating "The wait is over... I will announce a key decision soon," has sparked an interesting debate in state politics. There is considerable suspense among Congress cadres and political circles alike regarding the nature of the decision she is about to take. Political analyses began immediately after Konda Surekha's post appeared, with various speculations circulating about her future political course of action. Having maintained silence for some time after being removed from her ministerial post, her indication that she is preparing for a major announcement has led to discussions about the potential for rapid political developments. There is also keen interest in how her decision might impact the Congress party. Meanwhile, Konda Surekha's daughter, Konda Susmitha, expressed deep dissatisfaction over her mother's removal from the cabinet. She challenged Chief Minister Revanth Reddy to contest directly against her mother and win, if he had the mettle. She remarked that while she had personally spoken about corruption issues involving Revanth Reddy's family, it was unjust to take action against her mother because of those comments. She clarified that her views had no connection to the party. Susmitha expressed deep anguish over the situation her mother is facing. Her remarks—"It is painful to see my mother like this; I curse Revanth Reddy for this"—have become a topic of discussion in political circles. Susmitha's reaction is being viewed as an indication of the Konda family's dissatisfaction. Attention is also focused on how the Congress leadership will respond to these comments. Meanwhile, the recent demeanor of Konda Surekha's husband, Konda Murali, has also become a focal point of political discussion. Some analysts interpret his gestures—specifically, the way he was seen twirling his mustache—as political signals. There is ongoing speculation in political circles about whether the Konda family is intentionally signaling their next course of action. These developments are fueling fresh speculation regarding future political equations. Overall, Konda Surekha's social media post, Susmitha's comments, and Konda Murali's attitude have sparked a new debate in state politics. Although there is no clarity yet on the Konda family's 'Plan B,' there is a prevailing view that the key decision they are expected to announce soon could influence political dynamics. All eyes are now fixed on the decision Konda Surekha is set to announce in the undivided Warangal district. She mentioned that an action plan is being formulated to fortify the party at the village level. She expressed confidence that party cadres would work collectively with the aim of hoisting the Congress flag in the upcoming municipal corporation elections. She stated that the Congress party in the district is moving forward on the path to victory by working in accordance with the aspirations of the people.

Bhadrachalam Temple Development Works Must Be Accelerated: Minister Ponguleti

September 4: State Minister Ponguleti Srinivasa Reddy directed officials to accelerate the development works of the Bhadrachalam Sri Sitaramachandra Swamy temple and complete them within the stipulated deadlines. Accompanied by District Collector Ankit and MLAs Tellam Venkatrao, Payam Venkateswarlu, and Jare Adinarayana, the Minister visited the temple and performed special prayers. On this occasion, temple priests offered Vedic blessings and honored him with *Teertha-Prasadam* and *Sesha Vastram* (consecrated cloth). After the *darshan*, the Minister inspected the temple development and reconstruction works on-site. He reviewed the progress of ongoing construction at the Chitrakuta Mandapam, Goshala, Annadana Satram, Vista Complex, the path to the Shiva temple, the Northern Gate (*Uttara Dwaram*), *Mada Veedhulu* (temple processional streets), and the areas surrounding the Rama temple. He inquired with officials about the quality of work, implementation



methods, and completion deadlines. He issued clear directives to contractors, architects, and officials from relevant departments to complete the Northern Gate works by the time of the Mukkti festival and to finish the remaining temple development works by Sri Rama Navami. He advised them to proceed with coordination and ensure there are no delays in the work. He stated that providing better facilities for devotees is the primary objective. The proposal to abolish Intermediate education must be dropped: Kalvakuntla Kavitha



Hyderabad, September 4: Kalvakuntla Kavitha, President of the Telangana Rakshana Sena, demanded that the government immediately abandon the idea of abolishing Intermediate education. Speaking at the "Save Inter Education – Jung Siren" meeting organized by the Intermediate Education JAC, she described the Intermediate system as a strong foundation for the state's education sector. She warned that attempts to dismantle this system would be detrimental to the students' future. Kavitha noted that she herself had benefited significantly from Intermediate education. She stated that Intermediate education emerged from positive reforms in the education system and that this model in the Telugu states is the best in the country. She pointed out that many talented engineers and professionals working in world-class organizations had risen through this educational system. Therefore, she argued, there is a need to further strengthen Intermediate education rather than abolish it. Kavitha expressed strong objection to the recent remarks made by Chief Minister Revanth Reddy. She emphasized the need for comprehensive consultations with intellectuals, education experts, and relevant stakeholders before making policy decisions on crucial matters like education. She criticized the government for its lack of clarity, pointing out the inconsistency between announcing the suspension of Intermediate admissions in one meeting and subsequently issuing admission notifications. Kavitha stated that abolishing Intermediate education would severely impact students—especially girls—from rural areas, as well as those from middle-class and poor families. She noted that many students are already facing hardships due to issues such as pending fee reimbursement dues and a lack of transport facilities. She urged the government not to make decisions that would place an additional burden on students under these circumstances. Kavitha also raised questions regarding certain recommendations made by the

Education Commission. She argued that the proposal to raise the Intermediate pass percentage to 45% and the suggestions concerning first-year examinations require reconsideration. She remarked that if the government rejects the commission that has already studied the matter for three years and submitted a report, the formation of new commissions would only lead to further delays. She emphasized the need for stability in educational policies. Kavitha demanded that the government provide a clear assurance in the Assembly that Intermediate education would not be abolished. She suggested that the government should take steps towards providing free education and healthcare in the state, noting that prioritizing these sectors would alleviate the financial burden on the public. She warned that, if necessary, the agitation to safeguard Intermediate education would be intensified under the aegis of the Telangana Rakshana Sena, and the struggle would continue until the government reverses its decision. entrusting responsibilities to women experienced in public service. With new leadership set to take charge of key bodies such as the Planning Commission, the Women's Commission, and the Kakatiya Urban Development Authority, officials anticipate the introduction of new initiatives and policy decisions in these sectors. These appointments are being viewed as a significant turning point for the state's development, women's welfare, and urban development.

CM Revanth Reddy Inspects Construction of Educational Institutions in Maddur



September 4: Chief Minister A. Revanth Reddy inspected the ongoing construction works of the Social Welfare Residential School and the Government Degree College in Maddur, Narayanpet district. During his district tour, the Chief Minister focused specifically on the development of educational infrastructure. He examined the progress of construction at the site and offered several suggestions to the officials. The CM reviewed the plans for the Social Welfare Residential School and noted the significance of the project, as it is being built on land that was acquired for public needs a decade ago and subsequently handed over to the government. He directed that a compound wall be built around the college and that safety standards be strictly adhered to. He insisted that there should be no compromise on the quality of construction and that government funds be utilized efficiently. During the visit, the Chief Minister interacted with local residents and sought their views. He stated that the government attaches the highest priority to the development of the education sector and noted that infrastructure development is proceeding with the aim of making quality education accessible in rural areas. Measures to Address Issues Faced by Gig and Platform Workers: Minister Ponnam Prabhakar



Hyderabad, September 4: Transport Minister Ponnam Prabhakar assured that the state government would respond positively to resolving the issues faced by gig and platform workers. Representatives of the Telangana Gig and Platform Workers Union met the Minister at his official residence on Friday and outlined various problems concerning the auto, cab, and app-based transport sectors. During the meeting, the union representatives brought their concerns to the Minister's attention and requested appropriate action. They appreciated the government's recent measures to address the issues faced by auto-rickshaw workers and expressed gratitude for the government's initiative to

hike auto fares—a move made after 2012. They highlighted the need for further assistance to transport sector workers, citing rising living costs, fuel prices, and maintenance expenses. The union representatives urged the government to expedite the implementation of Motor Vehicle Aggregator guidelines. They requested the formulation of clear regulations to ensure fairness for drivers operating auto-rickshaws, cabs, and goods transport vehicles within app-based services. They also called for government measures to ensure transparency and equal opportunities within the sector. Union representatives urged the effective implementation of the 'Motor Vehicle Aggregator Guide-

lines-2025' to regulate app-based transport companies like Ola, Uber, Rapido, and Porter. They requested that measures be taken to ensure mandatory compliance with the minimum base fare, per-kilometer charge, and per-minute charge determined by the government, noting that this would improve drivers' earnings. The representatives also called for the strict enforcement of regulations regarding private vehicles used for app-based passenger and goods transport. They requested that commercial registration be made mandatory under the Motor Vehicles Act, 1988, wherever applicable. Additionally, they urged the government to consider increasing vehicle hire charges, taking into account rising fuel prices and vehicle maintenance costs. Minister Ponnam Prabhakar stated that the government would positively consider the issues raised by the union representatives. He assured them that steps would be taken to discuss the concerns of auto, cab, gig, and platform workers with the relevant officials and make appropriate decisions. The Minister emphasized that the government's goal is to strengthen the transport system to ensure better services for passengers while also safeguarding the interests of the drivers. He assured representation for various social groups.



Minister Ponguleti Promises Strict Punishment for Accused in Sirisha Murder Case



September 4: State Minister Ponguleti Srinivasa Reddy expressed deep anguish over the murder of Uke Sirisha, a staff nurse from Choutigudem village in Mulakalapalli Mandal. He consoled the victim's family and offered words of strength to the deceased's mother and other family members, assuring them of the state government's full support during this



tragic time. In the presence of District Collector Ankit and local MLAs—Tellam Venkatrao, Payam Venkateswarlu, Jare Adinarayana, and Koram Kanakaiah—the Minister handed over government assistance to the family. He presented a cheque for ₹5 lakhs and the sanction proceedings for an 'Indiramma' house, promising all necessary support to the family. The Minister made it clear that strict legal action would be taken against the accused responsible for Sirisha's murder. He directed officials to ensure the investigation proceeds without any negligence and reiterated the government's commitment to securing justice for the victim's family. Additionally, he ordered the concerned police officials to immediately inspect the hostel where the incident occurred, which falls under the jurisdiction of the Pahadishareef Police Station in Hyderabad. Instructions were issued to submit a comprehensive report regarding lapses in safety standards and management. It was stated that strict action should be taken concerning the management of the hostel and the hospital, if necessary. The Minister ordered that legal action be taken against the concerned individuals if any negligence or irresponsibility is established regarding the incident. Directives were given to conduct an inquiry into those responsible for managing the hospital and hostel and to ensure appropriate action is taken. It was made clear that the government would not compromise on the issue of women's safety. The Minister stated that the matter would be discussed with Chief Minister Revanth Reddy to ensure full justice for the victim's family. He emphasized that the government accords the highest priority to the safety and protection of women. He affirmed that the government would strive to ensure justice for the victim's family by taking legal action to prevent the perpetrators in the Sirisha murder case from escaping punishment. police personnel, candidates, and officials from relevant departments participated in the event and expressed their best wishes for the success of the training program.

Harish Rao Criticizes Congress Government Over '22-A' Land Issue



September 4: Former Minister Harish Rao criticized the Congress government, alleging that farmers' lands in the state are being held captive under the '22-A' prohibited list. Participating in a protest program in Koutala, within the Sirpur-Kaghnagar constituency, he demanded that the government immediately resolve issues concerning farmers' lands. He affirmed that the BRS would continue its struggle to protect farmers' rights. Harish Rao alleged that thousands of farmers in the Kaghnagar constituency are facing severe hardships because 42,867 acres of land have been placed on the 22-A list. He noted that vast tracts of

land across the Koutala, Chintalmanepalli, Bejjur, Kaghnagar, Sirpur, Panchikalpet, and Dahegaon mandals have been included in this prohibited list. Consequently, farmers are struggling as they are unable to sell their lands or secure loans. Harish Rao remarked that banks are refusing to grant loans because the lands are on the 22-A list, causing the farmers' financial situation to deteriorate further. He stated that farmers are being forced to make repeated rounds of government offices because land registrations are not taking place, even when they wish to sell their land to fund their daughters' weddings. He re-

marked that it is inappropriate to portray farmers as encroachers and urged the government not to humiliate them. Harish Rao recalled that the previous BRS government had granted rights over *Podu* lands to tribal communities. He alleged that the current Congress government is attempting to strip farmers of their rights by placing their lands on the 'prohibited list.' He urged the government to take a clear decision to resolve the uncertainty surrounding the farmers' lands. Harish Rao criticized the government and the concerned ministers for making conflicting statements regarding the 'Section 22A' list issue. Noting that lakhs of acres of land across the state are currently on the prohibited list, he demanded that the government disclose full details to the public. He suggested that farmers' issues should be viewed from a humanitarian perspective rather than a political one. Harish Rao called upon the government to ensure justice for farmers by removing their lands from the prohibited list. He affirmed that the BRS would continue to fight on behalf of the farmers until the issue is resolved. He appealed to the government to intervene immediately, provide clarity regarding the lands that serve as the farmers' livelihood, and alleviate their concerns.

Minister Seethakka Counters BRS Criticism

September 4: Minister for Panchayat Raj, Rural Development, and Women & Child Welfare, Dr. Danasari Anasuya Seethakka, criticized the BRS for labeling the Congress party as "Pacha Congress" (a derogatory term implying an alliance with the TDP), calling the remark laughable given that the BRS itself is filled with leaders who migrated from other political parties. Speaking at a press conference in Mulugu, she stated that the BRS lacks the moral authority to make such criticisms after having inducted leaders from other parties on a large scale. She advised KTR to examine his own party's history before commenting on others. Questioning whether there were no leaders from other parties within the BRS, the Minister remarked that political standards do not change simply because someone moves from one party to another. She raised the question of whether individuals are considered "pure" if they join the BRS but "unethical" if they remain in other parties. She emphasized that political criticism should be based on facts and that there is no room for double standards. Seethakka alleged that BRS and BJP leaders are unable to tolerate the welfare and development programs being implemented by the Congress government in the state. She noted that promises made to the public are being fulfilled in



phases, highlighting initiatives such as the construction of 'Indiramma' houses, farm loan waivers, bonuses for fine-variety paddy, and free electricity, all of which are directly benefiting the people. She stated that the government is continuously striving for the welfare of the poor. The Minister demanded that the BRS explain to the public how many of the promises made during their ten-year rule were actually fulfilled. She questioned the status of promises such as appointing a Dalit as Chief Minister, providing free education from KG to PG, and delivering double-bedroom houses. She suggested that opposition parties should account for their own governance before criticizing the current government. The Minister made it clear that they are ready for a debate—backed by facts and figures—regarding the wel-

fare schemes being implemented by the people's government. She challenged BRS leaders to an open debate on issues such as farm loan waivers, crop bonuses, job recruitment, and women's welfare programs. At the same time, she demanded that they inform the public about what the BJP government at the Centre has done for Telangana. Seethakka emphasized that politics should be conducted with dignity and respect. She warned that personal attacks, derogatory posters, and demeaning political tactics would not be tolerated. While acknowledging that criticism is natural in a democracy, she stated that stooping to a personal level in politics is inappropriate. The Minister clearly stated that any attempts to disrupt the peaceful atmosphere in the state would be met with a strong, democratic response.



Konda Surekha's Removal is Painful, But Party Discipline is Paramount: Mahesh Kumar Goud



September 4: TPCC President Mahesh Kumar Goud responded to the issue of Konda Surekha's removal from the Telangana cabinet. While acknowledging that the decision was personally painful, he emphasized that party discipline holds the utmost priority. He made it clear that action is inevitable against anyone violating party rules—regardless of their leadership rank—and that the Congress high command does not compromise on discipline. He made these remarks while speaking to the media in Delhi on Friday. Mahesh Kumar Goud revealed that the AICC took a serious view of the comments made against the party by Konda Surekha's daughter, Sushmita. He noted that the high command also took note of the fact that Konda Surekha did not immediately condemn those remarks. He explained that action was taken based on a comprehensive report submitted by the disciplinary committee regarding the matter. He stated that the high command adopts a strict stance on issues that damage the party's reputation. He reminded everyone that there are numerous internal forums available to discuss any differences of opinion or issues within the party. He stated that there are always avenues to discuss issues with leaders such as the PCC President, the State Affairs In-charge, and AICC General Secretaries. He remarked that airing party matters publicly before the media is inappropriate in such situations and warned that actions undermining party discipline would not be tolerated. "Any leader within the Congress party must observe boundaries while speaking; disciplinary action is inevitable if those limits are crossed," Mahesh Kumar Goud clarified. However, he acknowledged Konda Surekha as a senior Congress leader and expressed his desire for her to remain with the party. He suggested that remaining committed to the party would certainly lead to future opportunities. Mahesh Kumar Goud also refuted allegations regarding Chief Minister Revanth Reddy's style of functioning. He stated that Revanth Reddy has no need to politically blackmail anyone. 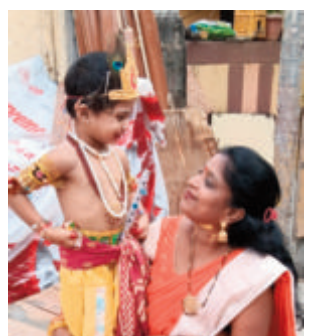
